Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your cooperation whilst learning from home. The students are doing a great job completing daily learning tasks. We appreciate your help.

As you may have already heard, learning from home will be extended until at least Friday, 30 July. This means that the same learning from home arrangements will continue.

- Students are encouraged to learn from home. Students may come to school **only if it is essential**.
- There will be minimal staff supervision as teachers are required to provide online feedback and plan lessons. Teachers are instructed to work at home where possible.
- Your child's teacher may need to come to school to supervise students. We will organise learning support or release from face to face for teachers to provide online feedback where possible during the day. Teachers will communicate and provide online feedback during school hours. Some of their time will be taken planning lessons or taking their lunch break.
- Student work packs will be available Monday morning from 8.15am to 9am. Kindergarten – Postman's Track gate, Years 1 and 2 – Fun4U gate (Lukin Street) and Years 3 to 6 - bottom oval gate. Please go to the gate of your youngest sibling and remember to bring your mobile phone to sign in using the QR code.
- We hope to have next week's learning from home plan on the school website by this Friday.
- Parents and carers cannot come onto school grounds. Students who need to come to school are to be dropped off at either the Fletcher Street or Lukin Street gates from 8:25am. In the afternoon, Kindergarten students will be picked up from the Postman's Track gate, Years 1 and 2 – Fun4U gate (Lukin Street) and Years 3 to 6 from the bottom oval gate. Please go to the gate of the youngest sibling.
- District Athletics Carnival has been cancelled. Should more information come to hand, we will let you know.

I appreciate your flexibility and patience during this time. Please do not hesitate to call the school if you have any questions. I will be sending out a learning from home survey soon so parents can provide feedback.
